Samuel Glassmyer Passes
Away At York Haven In
84th Year

FORMER YORK RESIDENT

1929

York Haven, July 18.—Samuel Glassmyer, a Civil war veteran, died at 8 o'clock this evening at the home of his step-daughter, Mrs. James E. Heckert, this place, after an illness of nine months, due to a complication of diseases. He was aged 83 years, 10 months and 18 days.

Mr. Glassmyer was born August 30, 1846, at York, the son of William and Helona (Luft) Glassmyer. On September 14, 1861, he enlisted as a private in Company C, 87th Regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry, and served under the late Captain Murray S. Cross. He was discharged as a corporal, October 13, 1864. He was a member of the General John Sedgwick post, No. 37, G. A. R., of York.

The deceased had been a resident of York for many years. He is survived by his step-daughter, and one step-son, Harry J. Reese, this place; and the following brothers and sisters,—John Glassmyer, Kansas City; Frank Glassmyer, York; Mrs. Katie Pfeifer, York; and Mrs. Lizzie Morrow, St. Louis. Eleven step-grandchildren also survive.

The funeral will be held from the funeral home of A. Zeigler Sons, at Manchester, Monday, at 10 a. m. Rev. F. B. Emenhaiser, pastor of the York Haven United Brethren charge, will conduct the services. Interment will be private.
